Hi guys – I went to the Community Council meeting on Monday night and just wanted to give you all some very brief feedback, as the risk of development to Shawwood and Broompark was discussed. It was pretty busy, so quite possibly a few of you were there too!

Most importantly, it was made clear to me that it is imperative we do as much as we can as quickly as we can in respect to saving Shawwood in particular.

Please try and come along to the meeting on 4th Nov.

Jackson Carlaw MSP has parliamentary funding to do a further postal consultation for 3,000 houses on this subject.

However, Councillor Bamforth was quite quick to point out that the Council does not need to pay attention to any consultations or reports at all and can make their decisions irrespective of any of this.

The flood implications are large, we have someone in contact with the Flood Prevention Group to work on this aspect.

The Community Council agreed that they would speak to the other local CCs and put together a joint statement against locating the leisure centre on green spaces.

The Community Council also agreed to join the group PERPPOS (Protect East Renfrewshire Parks and Public Open Spaces).
